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Local foodies who follow "Outrageous Food" on the Food Network are in for a treat next season when Bad Boyz Bistro is featured for its hottest hot wings.

The show's production company was filming all day Monday and will be on scene again today at the downtown Bedford restaurant, owned by Bryan Speck.

On Outrageous Food, "Big Chef" Tom Pizzica, season six finalist from "The Next Food Network Star," unearths the most jaw-dropping, eye-popping, occasionally heart-stopping foods in the country — dishes that give "outrageous" a whole new meaning.
